

Dear members

With a sense of exhilaration I would like to proudly announce that our club has won against the Madras Golf Club in Chennai after a long gap of 16 years. Our fellowship team winning was the feather in our cap..Congratulations to all the players for playing to win.

An interesting fact about this...

This inter-club match was started 147 years ago when our members would ride on horseback and vice versa to participate in this annual event. With the exception of the world war years and the Covid year this has continued uninterrupted to this day.

A quick update on the status at the Registrar of Societies. We have collated all the relevant documents including proof of timely submission and fee payment acknowledgements since 1997 and sought a one time approval from the Government in lieu of the deemed approval route, especially for all the changes made to the rules of the Club over the years.

New cases continue to pile up regarding the increase in fees from Rs. 1 lakh to Rs. 5 lakh. Till a final decision is taken by the General body everybody including the CSW associates will need to bide their time. Fiscal discipline is being adhered to and the quarterly statement of accounts are up on the notice board.

A new purchase policy has been implemented using 'Easy Source' a reverse auction site.

A GST matter has been adjudicated in the Club's favour, avoiding an unnecessary payment of Rs. 25 crore.

For easier access the Pro Shop has been moved to the ground floor. This will allow enough space for

the entire BGC administration to be co-located in the New Club House for the convenience of the members and for efficient running of the club.

The MC is actively considering a 'go green' policy and the initiatives will be announced shortly. Suggestions from members regarding this is welcome.

The Independence Day Tournament sponsored by our member M. K. Satya and the Justice Subramanyam lyer Cup were conducted well without a glitch in August.

Congratulations to all the winners.

Behind the Scenes with K. M. Srinivas

For so many of us the Bangalore Golf Course is a home away from home. Not just the 18 holes of intense rivalry but the entertainment, dining and socializing that we rely so heavily on. But how many of us have spared a thought to contemplate how this machinery runs seamlessly day in and day out. A large part of this is driven by a person that has spent over four decades ensuring that all of this is executed flawlessly and that we all have a truly homelike experience at BGC.

K. M. Srinivas is a vital cog in this expansive and complicated machinery. As the person in charge of entertainment, banquets, and the bars, this superhero in his black suit often lurks in the background, just behind the scenes. His tireless efforts truly keep the wheels turning.

Srinivas first joined the Bangalore Golf Club way back in 1983. He has worked his way up from starting as an office boy with a salary of Rs. 6 per day to waiter, bar man, assistant steward, assistant manager to manager. He fondly recalls the days when there were a handful of members that not only played golf but also frequented the 19th hole at the Old Club House (the only club house at the time) and treated him like a part of their family. Several of them also helped Srinivas get a BA Degree from VV Puram College in 1987. From remembering their favorite beverage and snack to knowing each one of them personally, Srinivas always had (and continues to have) time for a quick conversation along with this trademark smile for everyone.

Today, Srinivas is tasked with ensuring that entertainment events smoothly (including the difficult job of liaising with the authorities and various vendors), private banquets hosted by our members are organized to perfection, bar stocks are maintained at the optimal level by negotiating fiercely with liquor vendors for the best possible rates, and that the outsourced canteen vendors are kept on their toes by serving us tasty, yet hygienic culinary fare. But more than all of this, it's his unique relationship with most members that really makes him stand out in a vast sea of often faceless, nameless service staff at BGC.

Srinivas is in a unique position to guide committee members navigate



the complex web, off the course, at BGC. I fondly remember during my term as committee member in charge of bar, entertainment and catering, he was single handedly responsible for continuity from one committee to the next, as well as guiding me in taking the right decisions in an environment that was entirely new, and often confusing. His intrinsic knowledge of how things ought to work is truly invaluable.

Srinivas is also very proud of the fact that BGC is playing a pivotal role in developing youngsters to excel in the game of golf – he fondly recalls how at the time there were only two youngsters playing golf – Amitabh Poddar & Baba Chandok. He is also especially grateful for the difference The Crow Trust is making to the lives of caddies and staff of the club. He is a firm believer that the current young & vibrant committee, led by our able Captain, will focus on developing BGC to reach even greater heights.

On a personal note, Srinivas was born in Mandya in 1963. He lives in Banashankari 3rd Stage with his wife Usha, and his two children – daughter Dhanusha, 27 and son, Dharani Kumar, 23. On his weekly Thursday off, Srinivas loves to spend precious time at home with his family & friends, watch a movie and visit a temple in the evening.

The next time you see Srinivas at the club, do go up and say hello and maybe extend your hand to acknowledge & thank him for all the tireless effort he puts in behind the scenes, to make BGC what it is for all of us. Home, away from home.
